WORD

God speaks to us in scriptures read, sung, and preached.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 65:1-9

The prophet announces God's impatience. The people's self absorption is idolatry, and images from pagan worship fill this reading. Like a vintner who crushes the grape to release the wine, God will use Israel's exile to establish a new community of the faithful.

¹I was ready to be sought out by those who did not ask, to be found by those who did not seek me. I said, "Here I am, here I am," to a nation that did not call on my name. ²I held out my hands all day long to a rebellious people, who walk in a way that is not good, following their own devices; ³a people who provoke me to my face continually, sacrificing in gardens and offering incense on bricks; ⁴who sit inside tombs, and spend the night in secret places; who eat swine's flesh, with broth of abominable things in their vessels; ⁵who say, "Keep to yourself, do not come near me, for I am too holy for you." These are a smoke in my nostrils, a fire that burns all day long.

⁶See, it is written before me: I will not keep silent, but I will repay; I will indeed repay into their laps ⁷their iniquities and their ancestors' iniquities together, says the LORD; because they offered incense on the mountains and reviled me on the hills, I will measure into their laps full payment for their actions.

⁸Thus says the LORD: As the wine is found in the cluster, and they say, "Do not destroy it, for there is a blessing in it," so I will do for my servants' sake, and not destroy them all. ⁹I will bring forth descendants from Jacob, and from Judah inheritors of my mountains; my chosen shall inherit it, and my servants shall settle there.

²⁷All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD; all the families of nations shall bow before God.

²⁸For dominion belongs to the LORD, who rules over the nations.

SECOND READING: Romans 5:1-5

Paul describes the life of faith with reference to God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. Even now, we have peace with God through Jesus, and our hope for the future is grounded in the love of God that we experience through Christ's Holy Spirit.

¹Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ²through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

GOSPEL: Luke 8:26-39

Jesus' mission includes foreigners, and his authority extends to the casting out of demons. Some who witness Jesus' work are seized with confusion and fear, but the man who was healed is commissioned to give testimony of God's mercy and power.

²⁶Then [Jesus and his disciples] arrived at the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. ²⁷As he stepped out on land, a man of the city who had demons met him. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he did not live in a house but in the tombs. ²⁸When he saw Jesus, he fell down before him and shouted at the top of his voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me"— ²⁹for Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many times it had seized him; he was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the wilds.) ³⁰Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" He said, "Legion"; for many demons had entered him. ³¹They begged him not to order them to go back into the abyss.

³²Now there on the hillside a large herd of swine was feeding; and the demons begged Jesus to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. ³³Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned.

³⁴When the swineherds saw what had happened, they ran off and told it in the city and in the country. ³⁵Then people came out to see what had happened, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. ³⁶Those who had seen it told them how the one who had been possessed by demons had been healed. ³⁷Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them; for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. ³⁸The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but Jesus sent him away, saying, ³⁹Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you. So he went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him





Every Boundary, Every Time

Luke's gospel offers us a frightening and beautiful glimpse of the kingdom today. Jesus takes a boat across to the other side of the sea, to a land of Gentiles, which is pretty much "the wrong side of the tracks" for a Jewish teacher. But Jesus knows that God's healing love reaches across seas, over religious boundaries, and past political divisions.

The first person Jesus encounters in this foreign land is a man possessed by demons. The man's community has resorted to shackling him for the sake of safety, and his naked and "wild" body imprisons him, ostracizing him from all relationships. But these boundaries are not a hindrance for God: Jesus shows that God's freeing love stands with those on the margins, touches the untouchable, and reaches in where danger lurks.

As we gather for worship today, we bring with us all the labels and boundaries that shackle us. We know just where we fit and, even more so, where we do not fit. We are tired of carrying our demons around, exhausted by the power they have over us and the ways they keep us apart from others. God calls us together to confess this captivity and then to watch as our Lord frees a man who is captive to demons. We confess that Jesus is Lord and trust in the promise that Christ will reach across every boundary, every time, to restore the untouchable, dangerous, and unlovable parts of us.

At the close of worship, someone will invite us to "Go in peace. Share the good news." Today, after receiving forgiveness, a nourishing word, and a meal of healing and strength for the journey, let us leave here freed once again from that which imprisons us, joyfully declaring how much God has done.

What is Stephen Ministry?

STEPHEN MINISTRY is a lay care-giving **ministry** that offers spiritual support and pastoral care. The program teaches laypersons to provide one-on-one care for individuals who request support. confidential care-giver and care-receiver relationship, usually conducted by weekly visits, may continue for months or years. 
WEEKLY WEDNESDAY GRACE WORSHIP
