COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION Lutheran Christians believe that in the sacrament of Holy Communion, by the power of God's Word and Holy Spirit, we receive the body and blood of Jesus Christ, along with the bread and wine, for our forgiveness and salvation. If you share in this belief, you are welcome to participate with us. Non-communing children and adults may come forward to receive a blessing. White grape juice is available, as well as gluten free wafers. If you desire to receive communion at your pew, please alert an usher during the prelude.

A NOTE TO PARENTS: First Lutheran Church welcomes children of all ages to be a part of our worship services. Children's Bibles are located in the pews and a number of items are available on a cart in the Nave Lounge to help them (and you) have a pleasant worship experience.

If you need to take a walk with your child, our speaker system provides audio of the service in the Nave Lounge and Library.

As part of our sound system upgrade, the sanctuary is now equipped with a **HEARING LOOP SYSTEM**. To benefit, your personal hearing aids must be equipped with a **'T' (Telecoil) setting**. When the 'T' coil setting is selected on your hearing aids while you are located in sanctuary pews, you will pick up the amplified sanctuary sound in your hearing aids. This can increase one's hearing and comprehension of the service from 10% to 90%.

THE CELEBRATION OF WORSHIP AT FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH

VIGIL OF EASTER

Before worship, talk to God. During worship, let God talk to you. After worship, talk to your fellow worshipper.

GATHERING

The Holy Spirit calls us together as the people of God.

WELCOME

Please gather outside the west doors, where there will be a small fire. All gather in silence. A small unlighted candle will be given to each worshipper.

INTRODUCTION

This is the night! This is our Passover with Christ from darkness to light, from bondage to freedom, from death to life. The resurrection of Christ is proclaimed in word and sign, and we gather around a pillar of fire, hear ancient stories of our faith, celebrate at the font and share the food and drink of the promised land. Raised with Christ, we go forth into the world, aflame with the good news of the resurrection.

GREETING

- P: Sisters and brothers in Christ, on this most holy night when our Savior Jesus Christ passed from death to life, we gather with the church throughout the world in vigil and prayer. This is the passover of Jesus Christ. Through light and the word, through water and oil, bread and wine, we proclaim Christ's death and resurrection, share Christ's triumph over sin and death, and await Christ's coming again in glory.
- C: Amen.

READING OF INSCRIPTION ON PASCHAL CANDLE

The presiding minister traces the inscription on the paschal candle, which is held by an assisting minister.

P: Christ, yesterday and today, (*Trace the sign of the cross.*)

The beginning and the end, (Trace the Greek letters, Alpha and Omega.)

To Christ belongs all time (*Trace the first numeral at the upper left.*)

And all ages; (Trace the second numeral at the upper right.)

To Christ belongs glory and dominion (Trace third numeral at lower left)

Now and forever. (*Trace forth numeral at lower right.*)

C. Amen

The presiding minister lights the paschal candle from the fire and says:

P: The light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

The assisting minister lifts the candle so all may see it.

PROCESSION OF PASCHAL CANDLE

The procession begins, led by assisting minister bearing the paschal candle. As the paschal candle passes, congregants light their candles. At three separate times, the procession stops, and the pastor leads this call and response:

P: The light of Christ.C: Thanks be to God.

Once the worship center is reached, the paschal candle is placed in its stand.

EASTER PROCLAMATION

P: Rejoice heavenly powers! Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God's people.

- P: The Lord be with you.
- C: And also with you.
- P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- C: It is right to give our thanks and praise.
- P: This is the night one God, now and forever.
- C: Amen.

Candles may be extinguished and placed in basket passed around.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

P: O God, you are the creator of the world, the liberator of your people, and the wisdom of the earth. By the resurrection of your Son free us from our fears, restore us in your image, and ignite us with your light, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

Congregation shall sit.

WORD

God speaks to us in scriptures read, sung, and preached.

FIRST VIGIL READING—Creation (Genesis 1:1-5)

RESPONSE—Psalm 136:1-4 (Spoken Responsively with Assisting Minister)

¹Give thanks to the LORD, for the LORD is good, for God's mercy endures forever.

²Give thanks to the God of gods, for God's mercy endures forever.

³Give thanks to the Lord of lords, for God's mercy endures forever;

⁴who alone does great wonders, for God's mercy endures forever.



SECOND VIGIL READING—Flood (Genesis 9:8-13)

RESPONSE—Psalm 46:1-3, 10 (Spoken Responsively with Assisting Minister)

¹God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

²Therefore we will not fear, though the earth be moved, and though the mountains shake in the depths of the sea;

³though its waters rage and foam, and though the mountains tremble with its tumult.

¹⁰"Be still, then, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations; I will be exalted in the earth."

THIRD VIGIL READING—Deliverance at the Red Sea. (Exodus 14:10, 13, 21-31)

RESPONSE—Exodus 15:1b-3 (Spoken Responsively with Assisting Minister)

²The LORD is my strength and my might, and has become my salvation; this is my God—this God I will praise; my father's God—this God I will exalt.

all your waves and your billows passed over me.

⁷As my life was ebbing away, I remembered the Lord;

and my prayer came to you, into your holy temple.

⁹But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you;



- C: Amen.


GREAT THANKSGIVING
