





A Gospel of Division

To you think that I have come to bring peace to the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division!" (Luke 12:49, 51). Jesus' words in today's gospel seem far different from the message of compassion and love we expect from him. Jesus shows us God's boundless love, but this is a message that provoked conflict. The message of Jesus led to his death at the hands of the religious and political authorities. His disciples feared the same fate—not without reason.

By choosing to become followers of Jesus, early Christians might have found themselves going against their own parents, siblings, or children. The Christian community became a new family, united as adopted children of God and siblings of Christ. Today, although faith and familial relationships exist in harmony for a large number of Christians in North America, the message of Jesus is still a source of division and conflict because of what the gospel calls us to do.

Jesus calls us into a kingdom unlike any of the kingdoms of this world. We are called to pursue justice for all people, to care for those on the margins, to seek God's will before our own. Jesus' message conflicts with our common cultural messages, which tell us to seek our own profit at others' expense, to look out for our own but not for those who are different. In a world that glorifies self-promotion and self-sufficiency, our Lord calls us to love.

Jesus did not come to bring a comfortable gospel. He came to bring a challenging gospel, one that calls us to oppose the powers of this world that harm, exclude, and instill hate. Following this gospel might even set us in opposition to our own friends and family. But the message Jesus brings is a message of salvation and of love for all people—and sometimes that requires taking a stand.
