Dear Siblings in Christ,

Do you have a back brace? Maybe you are one of the many in our congregation that receive steroid shots in aching joints. Maybe a pinched sciatic nerve? Back pain is synonymous with life. We carry loads, carry children, sit too long, have poor posture, twist the wrong way, and the core of our body revolts. CDO AND CARING FOR KIDS 1ST WORK TOGETHER TO MAKE PLAYGROUND IMPROVEMENTS

This is a very exciting time for two of First Lutheran's children's programs. Our Children's Day Out Preschool (CDO) and our summer elementary school-aged childcare (Caring For Kids 1st) have recently received Sustainability Grants. Sustainability Grants are available to all Kansas Department of Health and Environment licensed childcare and preschool programs in the state of Kansas to assist with hardships they may have experienced as a result of the Covid pandemic. The two programs are working together to use a portion of their grant funds to share the cost of some significant improvements to our playground.

A few of the more significant playground improvements will include a new interlocking stone block boarder around an enlarged wood fiber play area and a new concrete boarder around the large sand box. The new boarders around these play areas will replace the current badly deteriorated wooden timber boarders. All new 12-inch-deep wood fiber will be placed around the playground equipment inside the play area.

The improvements will also include a new handicapped accessible sidewalk into the wood fiber play area. A new piece of playground equipment will be installed alongside the existing play pieces. In addition, a large permanent sunshade will be installed over a portion of the sandbox.

The playground improvements are expected to begin soon and should be completed within a few months.

DOORSTEP NEWSLETTER ARTICLE

As we finish year-end paperwork, thank you's, grant reports, etc. here at Doorstep, life has not stopped, and the phone calls keep coming for assistance!

In many ways 2021 felt like a repeat of 2020, in good ways though too. Our member congregations, and the Topeka community, continued to step up and support Doorstep, and the services we offer. We received more CARES funds to assist with rent assistance. And, for the many other people who still had 'life happen' to them like non-COVID times, we did our best to help with all of those in need that we could.

In 2021, Doorstep spent \$342,434 on emergency services; this is over \$91,000 more compared to 2020. It was a challenging year, and our small staff is incredibly grateful to our volunteers who kept coming in week after week to help us provide services, sort donations, and help clothing room clients. We also feel very blessed by the support we have received from the Topeka community during this time!

In June we had our 55th Anniversary Kick-off to raise funds for a new HVAC system at Doorstep. The current system, original to the building, is over 60 years old. At year end, we had donations of \$50,000! That is 1/3 of the amount needed... we have another \$100,000 to go! We are working on a match donation opportunity in February, and more information will be coming...

Unfortunately, with COVID still an issue, we will not have Operation Soup Line in 2022.

Finally, **Thank You** to everyone who donated money, blankets, games, puzzles and hygiene items for **Doorstep's Christmas Project** this past December! We assisted a total of **259 households with 822 individuals**! Hopefully, next year we can be back to 'normal' with the actual Christmas Store.
