# From Pastor Jenny

Dear Siblings in Christ,

The stores have boxes of bunny decorations and pastel candy ready to be loaded onto shelves in just a few weeks, when the hearts of Valentine's Day are taken down. Are you ready? Before you receive the next newsletter, we will have begun the season of Lent, with Ash Wednesday on February 14<sup>th</sup>. 
