## From Pastor Jenny

Dear Siblings in Christ, members, and friends of First Lutheran,

First... love. First... kindness. First... mercy. First... tenderness. First... grace. First... prayer.

At the foot of each email, report, and article, this year I share the verse Matthew 6:10, from Jesus' lesson to the disciples on how to pray. "Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." It is an invitation to believe and hope for God's kingdom to come to earth and to be part of that kingdom work. But what does that look like? What does this kingdom coming to earth look like in the midst of pain and suffering? How are we to be part of it? Wednesday, our region was shocked by the shooting that took place during the Chief's Superbowl celebration parade, where 1 million people were gathered. From WIBW, KC Police Chief Stacey Graves said that the 22 people injured in the shooting ranged between the ages of 8 and 47 years old, half of whom were younger the age of 16. A mother of two was also killed. News reports today suggest the shooting happened because of a personal dispute between individuals and not in response to the Chiefs win.

What does this mean for us, as believers of the Prince of peace, whose kingdom is one of justice and love and mercy?

People of First Lutheran, I invite you to think about how we can respond with tangible acts to help make a difference, when violence, sickness, fear, loss, etc. seek to overwhelm us, First (Lutheran)... be love. First (Lutheran)... show kindness.

First (Lutheran)... offer mercy.

First (Lutheran)... respond with tenderness.

First (Lutheran)... model grace.

First (Lutheran)... pray fervently.

In your home, work, family, in the community, in our world, I pray that we can be leaders in making a change to bring God's kingdom to earth as it is in heaven. God is with you.

## LENT 2024 THEME: HOLY LAMENT

This series explores various kinds of lament found in scripture. Each week we will consider what it means to sit with our grief rather than try to push it aside. We will discover that many faithful believers have wrestled with grief, sorrow, and questions for God about why the innocent suffer. This series understands lament as one of the more faithful things we can do. When we approach God with honesty and humility, and we admit that some things are too big for our hearts to bear, we will find there is not a disapproving God but one who weeps with us. We will find a God who can take our grief and disappointment and transform them into holy joy and renewed hope. We will learn, ultimately, that Jesus' death on the cross—the place to which the season of Lent leads us—is the reason we never mourn as those without hope.

## Children's Day Out Preschool



CHILDREN AND FRIENDSHIPS Student enrollment: 85

We often receive lots of questions about children and their friendships. Friendships are important for all of us. Early childhood educators know the value of friendships in children's lives. Very young preschoolers, two and three-year old's, are still very self-centered in their interactions with others. They are beginning to enjoy friends, but often have difficulty relating to other's feelings or ideas. Four and five-year old's friendships are *very* important to them. However, they do not have the social graces associated with quality friendship. They can be blunt, rude, or fickle in their dealings with their friends. They will often inform a child that they can't come to their birthday party, or that they don't want to be "best" friends any longer. Best friend relationships can last for only an afternoon or even an hour.

CDO teachers work hard to facilitate children's beginning attempts at friendship. They model for children appropriate friendly behavior and help children learn to include everyone in their play. It is an important aspect of preschool, for it is the good hard work of learning how to get along in life!
